


First 1000 days of life: the foundation of life!

The Ability to Change Brains Decreases Over Time




Translating the Science into Practice



- Good nutrition to feed and nourish the brain during the sensitive periods of development.
- Stimulation and enrichment to spark neural connections to increase the brain's capacity and function.
- Safety and protection to buffer against toxic stress.


HOW?



- ECD Action Network is to advance progress toward Sustainable Development Targets for young children (April 2016).
- The Action Network engages diverse global partners committed to action, with the capacity to invest and measurably improve the lives of young children and their families.

1. ECD Multisectoral Packages

Health, Care and Nutrition... to feed and nourish the architecture of the body, including the brain, during sensitive periods of development.




- Higher-quality mother-child interaction.
- Increased support for maternal psychosocial wellbeing.
- Better quality of the home environment for child rearing.
- Increased knowledge and practices pertaining to care for health, feeding and development.
- Better cognitive, language and motor development outcomes for children.

Family Support and Strengthening Package

3Ss:

- (i) access to quality **S**ervices (e.g., antenatal care, immunization, nutrition);
- (ii) **S**kills building (e.g., positive and responsive parenting to reduce harsh discipline and promote stimulation); and
- (iii) **S**upport (e.g., social protection, safety networks, family support policies)

Increase the likelihood that families are better able to provide nurturing care for their children.

2. Educated workshop

UNICEF, government an non-government partners lead and manage multi-sectoral programmatic interventions, staff need to be supported and their capacities built as ECD leaders

Complex challenges of advancing an ECD agenda and working across sectors, government ministries, donors and private sector call for skilled leadership and social force

3. ECD Measurement: Early Childhood Development Index

→Using data for the innovative ECD revolution: 58 countries with available data:

- Are children aged 3 and 4 years developmentally on track? (literacy-numeracy, physical development, social-emotional development and learning)
- Are children appropriately nourished?
- Do parents stimulate their children? Do they play with them and respond to their needs?
- Are children exposed to violence? Do they live in peaceful, development-conducive environments?






The Cost of inaction is too high: Lowered 25% earnings
